



Global warming: Causes and effects

The cultivation should be suitable and the data on the studies and experimentations covering all aspects should be collected..."

On 25 July 2011, His Majesty the King gave the initiatives on the problem of landslides and the selection of plant species to grow in the highland.



His Majesty recommended the growing of trees with primary roots, fast-growing trees and intercropping of vetiver in highland and mountainous areas.

His Majesty has continuously given his initiatives which up to now counted for over 30 times, covering various aspects as follows:

- **Research and experimentation**
- Soil and water conservation
- Plantation methods
- Propagation and protection of plant genetics
- Protection of forest fires
- Dissemination and extension works


Implementation in Response to the Royal Initiatives

Started in 1991, 10 agencies involving in the implementation with the Office of the Royal Development Projects Board (ORDPB) working as the central agency



Implementation in Response to the Royal Initiatives

- Setting up the Committee on the Development and Promotion of the Utilization of Vetiver Grass According to the Royal Initiatives with the task of formulating policies and frameworks
- **Established two sub-committees: the Sub-committee on Academic,**Monitoring and Evaluation; and the Sub-committee on Dissemination and Public Relations





MASTER PLANS for the Development and Promotion of the Utilization of Vetiver Grass were drafted as guidelines for implementations.

1st Master Plan

(1993 - 1994)

focuses on basic and applied research



2st Master Plan

(1997 - 1999)

focuses on researches and the dissemination of knowledge according to the royal initiatives, together with creating knowledge and understanding among the target groups

3st Master Plan

(2002 - 2006)

focuses on promotion and dissemination of the utilization of vetiver for soil and water conservation as well as natural resources and environmental rehabilitation among public and private agencies and farmers



MASTER PLANS for the Development and Promotion of the Utilization of Vetiver Grass were drafted as guidelines for implementations.

4st Master Plan

(2007 - 2011)

focuses on holistic development approach, integrated cooperation of the agencies concerned in the sustainable utilization of vetiver technology on natural resources and environmental conservation

5st Master Plan

(2012 - 2016)

focuses on a vision to drive the project implementation through the practices by the farmers under the vetiver networks which scatter in the country – *on going*





Over 50 agencies, both public and private, have continuously been taking part to fulfill the royal initiatives as follow:

50 Agencies

Researches:

There are 225 researches, on basic scientific research (genetics, growth and propagation), agriculture, intercropping, soil and water conservation, environment, utilization and dissemination.


Promotion and extension:

Since 1992 more than 3,000 millions vetiver slips have been cultivated throughout the country.




