

## 1. CONFERENCE THEME

*“Vetiver for Soil and Water Conservation:*

*In Commemoration of His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej The Great”*

The person behind the success of vetiver technology in Thailand is His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej The Great (King Rama IX), the first person in the country to recognize the value of vetiver and to start experimenting with it since early days, after having carefully studied the approach of the World Bank in using vetiver grass. His Majesty the Late King gave the first royal initiative on 22 June 1991 to encourage the utilization of vetiver in Thailand for soil and water conservation.

For 28 years, vetiver has proven to be an effective and low-cost technique which readily be practiced by farmers for slowing water-runoff, reducing erosion, and increasing the soil moisture for crop and plant growth. Apart from soil and water conservation, vetiver has also presented other potential economic values such as for fodder, mulch, essential oils, animal bedding and handicrafts.

On 4 – 8 February 1996, Thailand received the honor form the Vetiver Network International (TVNI) to host the First International Conference on Vetiver (ICV-1) in Chiang Rai, Thailand. The following ICVs took place with ever-growing interest at Petchaburi (ICV-2: Thailand, 2000); Guangzhou (ICV-3: China, 2003); Caracas (ICV-4: Venezuela, 2006); Lucknow (ICV-5: India, 2011) and Danang (ICV-6: Vietnam, 2015).

During 26 – 29 October 2020, the Chaipattana Foundation and the Office of the Royal Development Projects Board (ORDPB), as a Secretariat of Thailand Vetiver Network and Pacific Rim Vetiver Network, are organizing the Seventh International Conference on Vetiver (ICV-7) in Chiang Mai, Thailand, under the theme *“Vetiver for Soil and Water Conservation: In Commemoration of His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej The Great”* in honor of His Majesty the Late King who was the initiator as well as strong supporter of scientific method of vetiver utilization for soil and water conservation.

The Conference is open to all scholars, experts, researchers, scientists and practitioners from all parts of the world with knowledge and experiences on the utilization of vetiver grass in all disciplines because the diverse uses of vetiver grass will ultimately

lead to soil and water conservation. It is believed that this conference will highly beneficial to the participants by offering a forum for the exchange of knowledge, views and experiences on various techniques and developments of vetiver grass utilization and its contribution to soil and water conservation.

Above all, the Organizing Committee is pleased to inform you that ICV-7 will be honored by the presence of Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn who will graciously preside over the Opening Ceremony of the conference.

The conference has three main sessions: plenary, concurrent and poster. All sessions will be based on seven major categories:

- 1) Soil and Water Conservation Attributes
- 2) Basic Research and General Studies
- 3) Pollution Control and Treatment / Restoration and Rehabilitation of Disturbed and Contaminated Areas
- 4) Disaster Prevention
- 5) Training and Technology Dissemination
- 6) Alternative Uses and Socio-economic Values of Vetiver

#### 4. INTERNATIONAL HANDICRAFT TRAINING COURSE

Within the scope of ICV-7, a free-of-charge international vetiver handicraft training course will be held on 26 - 28 October 2020, all day, at the Shangri-La Hotel, Chiang Mai, Thailand. The training course is opened to all of those who work in the handicraft industry or simply interested in using vetiver leaves in handicraft-making and applying this initiative in their countries.

The training course, supported by the PTT Public Company Limited, aims at providing participants with a comprehensive overview of the entire vetiver handicraft-making process as well as instructing them in detail how to make real products themselves. Similar training courses had also been organized during previous ICVs in Thailand, China, Venezuela, India and Vietnam.

No registration fee has to be paid for attending the International Handicraft Training Course. All trainees will receive, as a compliment from the Organizing Committee, all

coffee breaks, meals during the conference period. However, the participants are required to pay for their own domestic/international travel and accommodation during the conference period. ## **5. KING OF THAILAND VETIVER AWARDS**

Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn, the Chairperson of His Majesty the King of Thailand’s Chaipattana Foundation, has graciously granted US\$10,000 of the King of Thailand Vetiver Awards from the Chaipattana Foundation for four of the most outstanding works on vetiver (prize money of US\$ 2,500 each) in the following categories:

### ***1. Outstanding Vetiver Research***

- 1.1 Agricultural Application
- 1.2 Non - agricultural Application

### ***2. Outstanding Dissemination and Application of the Vetiver System***

- 2.1 Dissemination and Technology Transfer
- 2.2 Application of the Vetiver System

In addition, the PTT Public Company Limited’s fund has been approved by Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn to provide two additional awards (prize money of US\$ 2,500 each) for the following categories:

### ***3. Outstanding People Participation***

- 3.1 On-farm Applications and Socio-economic Impacts
- 3.2 Disaster Mitigation or Environmental Protection

The six winners will receive the awards from Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn, the Patron of The Vetiver Network, on His Majesty the King of Thailand’s behalf, during the Opening Ceremony of the Seventh International Conference on Vetiver (ICV-7) on 26 October 2020 in Chiang Mai, Thailand. With the support from the Chaipattana Foundation, the recipients of the awards will have the honor to present their papers during the Conference and be covered for the cost of

participation at ICV-7 as well as the international travel between their home country and the conference venue, including accommodation during the conference period.

The deadline of paper submission for the awards is **31 March 2020**. Award winners will be announced on **31 May 2020**.

## 6. THE VETIVER NETWORK INTERNATIONAL AWARDS

The Vetiver Network International is pleased to announce the seventh series of **Vetiver Awards** in anticipation of the Seventh International Conference on Vetiver (ICV-7), to be held in Chiang Mai, Thailand, 26-29 October 2020. IVC-7's theme will be "*Vetiver For Soil & Water Conservation: In commemoration of His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej.*" Past competitions have provided a wealth of contributions that significantly increased our knowledge of the uses of Vetiver Grass and its applications and benefits. We anticipate that this new round of Awards will be equally, if not more, beneficial for advancing our knowledge and appreciation of the Vetiver System.

Three sets of Awards will be given:

- **The Vetiver Champion Award.** This Award will be given in recognition of an individual's impact at the country or regional level in **promoting Vetiver Grass Technology to communities and/or for public good**. The process for nominations will be carried out online so that the more than 4,000 Vetiver Network members who participate in social media sites – Facebook, including the many affiliated Facebook pages around the world, the Vetiver Blog, the TVNI website, and the various online forums/communities – can identify and nominate deserving individuals. The winner, in addition to a certificate, will receive \$1,500. The winner, if they attend ICV-7, will receive their Award on-stage and be given the opportunity to make a full presentation of his/her work and vision for the future.
- **Vetiver Grass Technology – Lessons, experiences and the path forward.** Three awards will be given for the best papers that address and bring together/focus on applying and building upon past research, bring lessons and experience from the field, analyze constraints, and propose priorities and practical strategies for future development and expansion of the use of the Vetiver System in the following areas: (a) **agriculture and soil and water conservation** (b) **infrastructure protection and disaster mitigation** and (c) **contaminated land and water**.

Overall, TVNI is seeking to move forward and scale up the use of the Vetiver System (VS) in the face of Climate Change; all papers should address VS and climate change

resilience/adaptation and/or mitigation in their particular context. The three winners, in addition to a certificate, will receive \$750 each. The papers receiving Awards will be announced at ICV-7 and be published in the Conference Proceedings.

- **Exceptional Individual Contributions.** In honor of four individuals who during their lifetimes made exceptional contributions to the promotion, development, and expansion of Vetiver System knowledge, TVNI will award:
  - **The Monty Yudelman Award** for exceptional contributions in sustainable agriculture and food security.
  - **The Mark Dafforn Award** for exceptional contributions in science and research.
  - **The Nick Dolphin Award** for exceptional contributions and success in community engagement and effective participation.
  - **The John Greenfield Award** for exceptional contributions in the promotion and application of Vetiver Grass Technology, especially for poor and rainfed farmers, in on-farm soil and moisture conservation.

### **Eligibility**

Individuals or groups, who have shown initiative in research, utilization or promotion of specific Vetiver Grass Technologies and/or of the broader Vetiver System are eligible. These may include farmers, technicians, NGOs, students, scientists, researchers, private companies, innovators, etc., who have produced and documented concrete, repeatable results. Anyone, other than members of the TVNI Board of Directors and their families who are not eligible, can be nominated. Self-nomination is also accepted.

To be eligible, the work presented must have been carried out by the individual or individuals submitting the paper and the actual, physical locations of the work must be georeferenced and reported in the submittal. This can be done, preferably, using the International Vetiver Grass Tracking App (iVGT), which is available at the iPhone App Store (IOS) or Google Play Store (Android). Individuals that have difficulty accessing or cannot use the app in their country, may instead provide the coordinates (latitude and longitude) of their applications. Note that most smart phones come with Apps that will provide coordinates (e.g., iPhone Compass) or one can utilize Google Earth or Google Maps.

To allow full participation of TVNI Board members in the review of nominations and submittals, all submissions must be in English. Where this is beyond the capability of the individual making the nomination or submittal, Google Translate (or other machine translation facility) may be used to translate from the original language and both the

machine translation and the original should be submitted. Due to the imprecision of machine translation, it should be understood that errors and ambiguities in the translation may affect the review committee's decision.

### **Deadlines**

- **The Vetiver Champion Award:** Nominations from the online community will be accepted until 1 February 2020. Selected semi-finalists will be requested to produce a short (maximum 1,000 words) description of their work and vision for the future and submit it to TVNI by 1 May 2020. The winner will be announced by 1 June 2020.
- **Vetiver Grass Technology – Lessons, experiences and the path forward:** Submissions will be accepted until 1 August 2020 and the winners will be announced by 1 October 2020.
- **Exceptional Individual Contributions:** Nominations will be accepted until 1 August 2020 and the winners will be announced by 1 October 2020.

### **Procedures and Documentation**

**The Vetiver Champion Award.** TVNI requests its members and users/participants in Vetiver-related social media (TVNI Facebook page and affiliated Facebook pages, Vetiver Blog, TVNI website, and the various online forums/communities) to nominate individuals who they believe have (a) made very significant and noteworthy contributions, including to the online community; (b) have put forward and demonstrated innovative ideas and applications; and (c) are individuals who are highly likely to have a great impact in the future. Nominations should include a short (maximum 1 page) description of the work and contributions of the individual being nominated and a justification for why this individual deserves to be selected for the Vetiver Champion Award.

A TVNI committee will select the 10 best nominations and, by 1 March 2020 will request the selected nominees to produce and submit a short description of their work and vision for the future. The submittal may contain up to 10 photos. Following the semi-finalists submittals by 1 May 2020, the TVNI committee review and announce the award winner. The submittals of all 10 semi-finalists will be published.

**Vetiver Grass Technology – Lessons, experiences and the path forward.** There are no requirements as to maximum or minimum number of pages. Papers should be complete and provide the necessary information that is requested, i.e., that the paper address and bring together/focus on applying and building upon past research, bring lessons and experience from the field, analyze constraints, and propose priorities and practical

strategies for future development and expansion of the use of the Vetiver System in the following areas in one (and only one) of the three areas of: (a) **agriculture and soil and water conservation** (b) **infrastructure protection and disaster mitigation** and (c) **contaminated land and water**. The documentation included may consist of many types of information (personal accounts, reports, articles, photographs, scientific papers, testimonials, etc.). Quality photographs (especially showing before and after vetiver installation, where relevant) should be included to both illustrate the work carried out, as well as evidence of work. Authors may be as brief as they desire, but clarity is essential. Simple summaries will not be sufficient.

**Exceptional Individual Contributions.** All persons receiving nominations for “The Vetiver Champion Award” will be automatically considered for these awards, as will those submitting papers for TVNI or King of Thailand Awards. Direct nominations may also be made. Nominations should include a description of the work and contributions of the individual being nominated and a justification for why this individual deserves to be selected for the proposed Award. There are no requirements as to maximum or minimum number of pages, but the nomination should provide ample evidence of the individuals actual work, contributions and direct impacts in one of the four areas. Quality photographs (especially showing before and after vetiver installation, where relevant) should be included to both illustrate the work carried out, as well as evidence of work. Simple summaries will not be sufficient.

### **Information Required**

1. Name and address of the nominee, postal address, email and telephone number if possible
2. Name and address of the nominator, postal address, email and telephone if possible
3. Project (in its widest sense) information:
  - a. Location of the project or work;
  - b. Description of the project or work;
  - c. Accomplishments of the project or work;
  - d. Importance of the project or work;
  - e. Supporting documentation is required for determining awards, including photographs and geo-referencing of project or work locations of applications and installations;
  - f. Name and address of a reference that is familiar with the project.

Emailed documents should be either in .doc, docx or .pdf format. If pictures are sent which are not embedded in the document, they should be in .jpg format. The maximum size of the document cannot exceed 8MB including embedded photos, charts, graphics, and appendices. ## 7. CALL FOR PAPERS AND POSTERS

Engineers, researchers, teachers, practitioners, government officials and other professionals are invited to submit papers related to the conference theme as well as other applications of vetiver system. Submitting well-documented case studies and experiences in applying Vetiver System in the practice of sustainable soil and water development is highly encouraged.

### *Specifications for Abstract and Full Paper*

The abstract should be between 400-500 words (1 page). The complete work should not be longer than 6,000 words (including figures and pictures, not more than 15 pages). Before submitting, all papers should be edited according to the following norms.

**Format:** The papers should be submitted as a Microsoft Word document (.doc or .docx), in Times New Roman (TNR) font, according to the following specifications:

- **Title:** TNR, capital letters, 14 points and bold black, centered;
- **Author(s):** TNR, 12 points normal. Initial of the first (and second) name(s), last name, institution(s) to which they belong, postal address and e-mail, centered;
- **Keywords:** TNR, 10 points, maximum five (NOT to include the word ‘vetiver’);
- **Text:** TNR, 12 points normal, single space, justified;
- **Graphs and pictures:** In black and white or color. Edit and place in the main text at proper places; and
- **Format of page:** A-size, margin: 2.5 cm right, top and bottom; and 3 cm for the left; single space.

**Contents:** The body of the paper should include the following sections: introduction; materials and methods; results and discussion; conclusions and references. Tables and figures should be inserted within the text at appropriate places. References should be included and listed in alphabetical order by last name of the first author according to the following norms: author, (if more than one author, use commas to separate them), year of publication, title, journal (abbrev.), volume, number, pagination (10, and 14 points of line space).

**Note:** This format is suitable for research papers but may be amended for submissions that are not research based.

### ***Specifications for Posters***

**Dimension:** Should not exceed 0.90 m wide x 1.20 m high

**Content:** Title, authors, institutions with its respective address, abstract, objectives, methodology, results, most relevant conclusions and the main references. For acknowledging some sponsoring institution(s), it should be mentioned at the bottom.

**Design of the poster:** It is recommended that the text of the poster has a font size that allows the reading from 2 m. It is suggested to use bold letters, with size between 8 and 12 mm and 15 to 20 mm for titles and sub-titles. The text must be concise, clear and precise, results supported with suitable illustrations, photographs, graphs and tables. Reference citations in the text must be minimal. The poster components need to be designed to convey the Questions and Answers, Objectives and Conclusions in a lucid manner.

**Note:** Authors will have to be present at the specific time to clarify questions during the exhibition of the poster.

## **8. EXHIBITIONS**

Throughout the conference period, three major exhibitions will take place at the Shangri-La Hotel, Chiang Mai. They are:

- 1) **Poster Exhibition:** shows the posters of vetiver works prepared by the participants.
- 2) **Scientific Exhibition:** features the works of different governmental and non-governmental agencies in Thailand regarding the research and development works of vetiver grass technology.
- 3) **Commercial Exhibition:** demonstrates and sells mainly local handicrafts made from vetiver grass developed and promoted by governmental and non-governmental agencies in Thailand.

## **9. POST-CONFERENCE TECHNICAL TOURS**

A one-day field trip will be organized on 29 October 2020 to enable the participants to visit the vetiver utilization and plantation in Chiang Mai. The Office of the Royal

Development Projects Board and the Chaipattana Foundation will support all expenses during the field trip (transportation and meals).

There are altogether four site visits namely:

- 1) Demonstration Center for the Development and Promotion of Vetiver Grass Utilization in the Forests Section 1, Pong Yaeng Subdistrict, Mae Rim District
- 2) Queen Sirikit Botanic Garden, Mae Sa Subdistrict, Mae Rim District
- 3) Kong Hae Village Agricultural Learning Center (Extension Area), Pong Yaeng Subdistrict, Mae Rim District
- 4) A model farmer's agricultural plot (Mrs. Pongpan Sa-Lee), Pah Pai Subdistrict, Sansai District

**Note:** Due to time constraint, these sites will be arranged into two routes for the participants to choose upon registration at the conference according to their preferences.

## 10. REGISTRATION

However, the participants are required to pay for their own domestic/ international travel and accommodation during the conference period.
