#### Vetiver Propagation in rice paddies or waterlogged areas





- Vetiver is the rotation crop after harvesting rice, or during the typhoon season
- fertilization and maintenance are optional
- Vetiver conditions the soil for the next rice planting season
  - **Spacing is 9 plants per square meter**

harvesting from rice paddies is easier, plants can be pulled out with less digging but takes more time to prep as the roots are wrapped in sticky mud

### **HARVESTING**

• harvesting mature Vetiver plant on clayish soild is difficult needing at least 2 men, but clean up is easy as the soil are shaken loose from the roots





- harvested plants are washed and cut into 8 inch clumps.
- the clumps are then split into planting slips and treated with organic fertilizers
